Unite members in Aramark, Compass and Trinity have voted YES to action.

Unite thanks all our members and shop stewards who worked so hard to drive the vote out and exceed the 50% threshold.

The turnout and support for action is a clear mandate to move forward with the dispute.

Unite is now making preparations for action. Your shop stewards and representatives will be discussing the most effective ways of action for COTA members to participate in.

To support this, the Unite COTA branch will be setting up a dispute fund. This dispute fund is an important part of building up resources to support workers who will be taking action. It is important to remember that disputes can take time to resolve and a dispute fund ensures that Unite has the resources to fight.

Unite will be keeping all our members updated on the dispute fund as this develops.

Unite will also be appealing to other Unite branches for support and the fund will be advertised across the whole of our offshore membership and at the heliports.

The COTA companies must now take notice of the anger that exists across the workforce. A further years pay freeze is unacceptable. Unite will continue to negotiate on any improved offer by COTA but we also must now move forward with our preparations for action.
